Feedback Analysis – Students Feedback on Curriculum

A small group of 8.4% reports that 100% of the syllabus is covered, while a larger segment, 30%, suggests that 90% is covered. This highlights differences in teaching approaches and underscores the need for a closer examination of curriculum pacing and instructional methods to ensure thorough coverage.
- Satisfaction with Teaching-Learning Process: The majority of students (45%) express satisfaction with the teaching-learning process, though a notable portion (39%) remains neutral. This signals a generally positive outlook but also points to the need for improvements to address the concerns of the neutral group and enhance overall satisfaction.
- Teacher Preparation and Communication: A significant number of students (54%) report satisfaction with teachers' preparation and communication skills. Additionally, 24% express delight, indicating a strong positive perception of teacher competency and communication, which is encouraging for the institution.
- 4. **Involvement in Co-curricular Activities:** The institution's involvement in cocurricular activities appears evenly split, with 32% indicating occasional involvement and another 32% reporting frequent engagement. This suggests an active effort to provide students with a balanced educational experience beyond the classroom.
- 5. Discussion of Outcomes and Competencies: A notable portion of students (37%) report that teachers frequently discuss course and program outcomes, as well as expected competencies. However, 31% indicate that this discussion occurs only occasionally, highlighting the need for a more consistent emphasis on learning objectives and outcomes.
- 6. Efforts in Student Monitoring and Continuous Improvement: Nearly half of the students (46%) acknowledge frequent efforts by the institution in student monitoring and continuous improvement of the teaching-learning process. However, 20% perceive these efforts as occasional, suggesting a need for more consistent and proactive measures in this regard.

- 7. Initiatives in Soft Skills and Employability Skills: The survey indicates a mixed response regarding initiatives in soft skills and employability skills, with 31% reporting regular efforts and 32% indicating occasional initiatives. This underscores the importance of integrating such skills into the curriculum and providing students with opportunities for holistic development.
- 8. Utilization of ICT Tools in Teaching: A significant portion of students (40%) observe that fewer than 50% of teachers use ICT tools and LCD projectors while teaching. This suggests a potential gap in technological integration that could be addressed through teacher training and support in utilizing digital resources effectively.
- 9. **Overall Rating of Teaching-Learning Process:** The overall rating of the teachinglearning process reflects a positive sentiment, with 37% of students rating it 4.75 out of 5 and another 33% rating it 4.3 out of 5. While the majority expresses satisfaction, the institution should continue striving for excellence to address areas of improvement.
- 10. **Conduct of Industrial Visits and Field Trips:** The frequency of industrial visits and field trips is perceived as occasional by 34% of students and frequent by 21%. This suggests a need for enhancing experiential learning opportunities to provide students with real-world exposure and practical insights relevant to their academic pursuits.

Conclusion: The analysis provides a nuanced perspective on various aspects of the teaching-learning process at Darul Uloom Arabic College Vazhakkad. While there are strengths, such as teacher preparation and communication and active involvement in co-curricular activities, there are also areas for improvement, particularly in syllabus coverage, technological integration, and consistency in initiatives for student development.

Recommendations: The analyzing committee recommends a comprehensive review of curriculum pacing to ensure adequate syllabus coverage without compromising depth. Additionally, there should be a focus on enhancing technological infrastructure and providing training for teachers to effectively utilize ICT tools. Consistent efforts should be made to engage students in discussions on learning outcomes and foster soft skills development. Furthermore, the institution should explore strategies to increase the frequency and diversity of industrial visits and field trips to enrich the educational experience. Overall, a commitment to continuous improvement and student-centered approaches will further elevate the teaching-learning process at Darul Uloom Arabic College Vazhakkad.
